RE: ASC Compliance Review of North Dakota's Appraiser Regulatory Program

Dear Jodie Campbell:

The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the North Dakota appraiser regulatory program (Appraiser Program) on May 20-22, 2025, to determine the Program's compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended.<sup>1</sup>

The ASC considered the preliminary results of the Review and the State's response to those results. The Appraiser Program has been awarded an ASC Finding of "Good." The final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) of the North Dakota Appraiser Program is attached.

The ASC identified the following areas of non-compliance:

- States must issue temporary practice permits within five business days of receipt of a completed application or notify the applicant and document the file as to the circumstances justifying delay or other action;<sup>2</sup>
- States must ensure the accuracy of all data submitted to the Appraiser Registry;<sup>3</sup>
- States must ensure that appraiser education courses are consistent with AQB Criteria;<sup>4</sup>
- States must ensure the delivery mechanism for distance education courses offered by a non-academic provider, including secondary providers, has been approved by an AQBapproved organization providing approval of course design and delivery;<sup>5</sup>
- States must resolve all complaints filed against appraisers within one year (12 months) of the complaint filing date in the absence of special documented circumstances; <sup>6</sup> and
- States must track all complaints on a complaint log containing the required information.<sup>7</sup>
