Dear Mr. Park:

I write to you on behalf of who contacted my office for assistance. It is seeking to have his name removed from the Appraisal Subcommittee's list of sanctioned appraisers.


The received word from the Nevada Real Estate Division that a complaint had

been filed against him. He responded promptly to this notification and never received any further contact from The Division. Nearly two years later, after relocating back to New Jersey, he received notice from The Division that his case was recommended for review by the Appraisal Advisory Review Committee and that he could either attend an informal conference with the Committee or not attend the conference and exercise his right to a hearing before the Nevada Appraisal Commission should a formal complaint be filed. He immediately contacted The Division and advised them that he was not residing or practicing real estate appraisal in Nevada. As would have been unable to leave New Jersey to attend a conference in Nevada, The Division informed him that he could voluntarily surrender his Appraiser License in lieu of other disciplinary action. As he had no plans to relocate back to Nevada, he opted to surrender his license. However, he was not informed that surrendering his license would place him on the Appraisal Subcommittee's list of sanctioned appraisers.

is unable to do so because his name is on this list. This list also prevents him from being able to work efficiently as an appraiser in New Jersey. In the six years he acted as a licensed appraiser in Nevada, he only had one complaint filed against him which led to this situation. As currently in good standing with the New Jersey Real Estate Division, I ask that you review his file and determine if a removal from the list of sanctioned appraisers can be granted.

I would appreciate if you would afford all due consideration under the law in his efforts. In addition, I would be interested in receiving your review and reply to this correspondence so that I may advise my constituent accordingly. Please forward your response
